Expanding the mission and purpose of Process Learning Centers (PLC):

Technology development in Sacramento: The PLC/VCI team is uniquely qualified to provide, set up, operate and maintain video conferring systems. Bridging and recording equipment allow face-to-face connections worldwide at any time. Several training and international video conferencing groups currently using VCI/PLC systems. Polycom 'Viewstation' cameras have been donated by VCI/PLC to community projects working with education, challenged

children and youth support groups. Renewed emphasis use of donated equipment to its full capacity. PLC is expanding its program of placing equipment with nonprofit organizations to include:

1. A youth development network.
2. A new science and math center.
3. A local Challenger Learning Center.
4. A court system for foster children. (CASA)
5. Two public education schools.
6. Three foster youth support groups.

Action steps for PLC expansion plan implementation:

- Identify and determine funding source for new PLC Executive Director position.
- Identify and name two additional members to PLC Board of Directors.
- Follow up on Polycom offer to have grant development person work with us.
- Develop PLC five-year plan.
- Intensify PLC relationship with Drexel University, Sacramento Campus..
- Learn from our contract with America At Work.
- Continue to develop training and web streaming concepts for clients.
- Follow up with Comcast Cable for bandwidth for CASA and other projects.
- Develop more international projects, such as the following:
